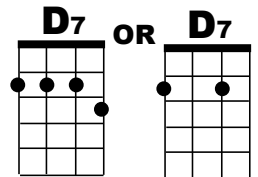
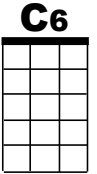
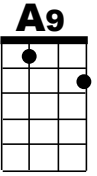


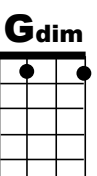
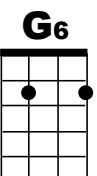
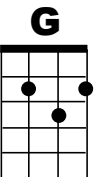
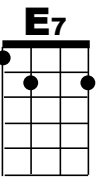
I Wish I Could Shimmy Like My Sister Kate
