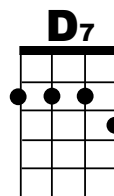
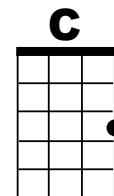


King of the Road

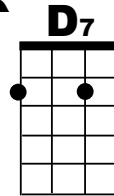

I'm a **G(1)** man of means by no means **D7(2)** King of the Road **G**

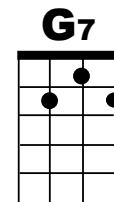
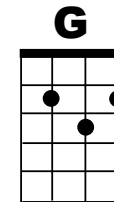


OR
