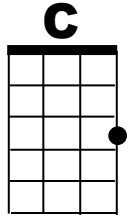

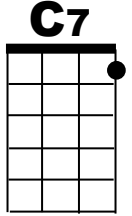

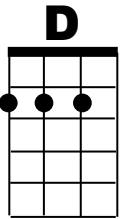

 My wild Irish Rose.....the sweetest flower that grows.



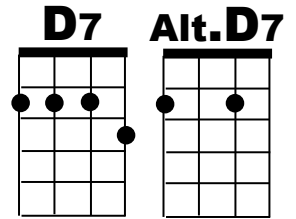
