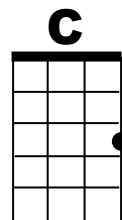

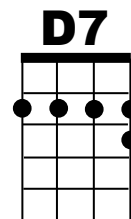

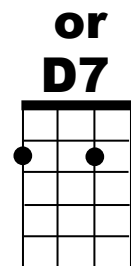
Well, I never felt more like singin' the blues

Your love dear, why'd you do me this way?



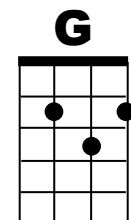
Well, I never felt more like cryin' all night
