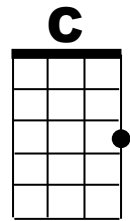


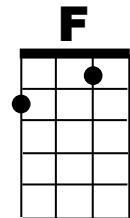
# Smokey the Bear

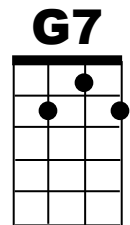
With a Ranger's hat and shovel and a pair of dungarees,

'cause ev'rybody knows that he's the Fire Prevention Bear.



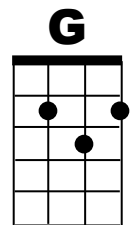
Chorus: Smokey the Bear, Smokey the Bear.
