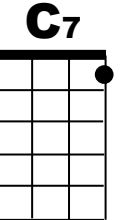
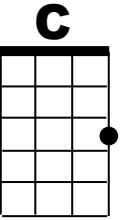
According to Wikipedia, he wrote this song because he got tired of hearing Kate Smith sing *God Bless America* on the radio in the 1930s!

BEGIN WITH CHORUS:

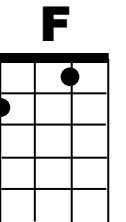

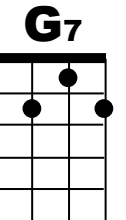
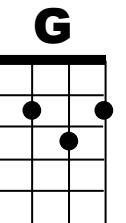
