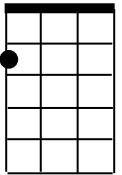

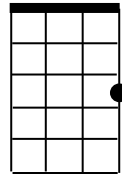

CHORUS: End with the last line, sung only once and **NO C7**

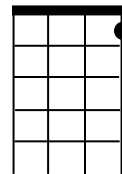
