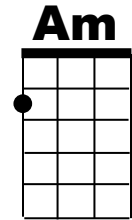


Waltzing Matilda

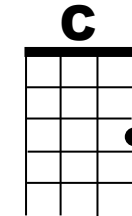

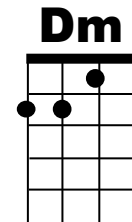
C E7 Am F

"You'll come a-waltzing, Ma--tilda, with me."

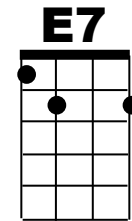


C E7 Am F

"You'll come a-waltzing, Ma--tilda, with me."



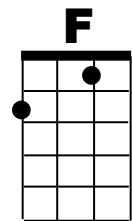
CHORUS:
